

As it was read, the story reminded me of my history, being a native of the South and attending public school during that era. I was reminded of how I could not attend my neighborhood (secondary) schools because I was black. I was bused to school. This served as a reminder of my experience of our racial divide.

In honor of Black History Month, Heywood Avenue School also received a wonderful Black History program, coordinated by radio personality, Ms. Shaila, from 107.5 WBLS, who connected us with Mr. Terry Gadson of the Irving Street Group and his "McDonald's Faces of Black History Tour." "The Faces of Black History Tour." "The Faces of Black History Tour." acknowledges the contributions of African Americans from slavery to the present. This live musical show salutes many well-known celebrities,

personalities and history makers, with an entertaining and educational presentation for all ages. From Negro spirituals to rap music and everything in between, the talented fourmember cast takes the audience on a high-energy excursion through African American culture.

The audience consisted of Kindergarten students through 4th grade, with innocence about the racial divide, learning about Black history. The presentation was done in a musical style, which kept students and teachers engaged. The McDonald's performers, two young ladies and two young men, were awesome, enacting the contributions of pioneers who have paved the way for others. The students really enjoyed the program!


