


Board Meeting Presentations

PARCC Results

Dr. Terri Russo, Director of Curriculum, Instruction, Professional Development, and Data Assessment presented the 2015-2016 results for the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC). Students took PARCC English Language Arts and Literacy Assessments (ELA) in grades 3 - 11, PARCC Mathematics Assessments in grades 3 - 8 and End of Course Assessments in Algebra I,



Geometry, and Algebra II. The results are posted on the district website and can be accessed via the Curriculum Overview webpage link: 2016 PARCC Results. Additionally, Dr. Russo shared preliminary graduation statistics for OHS, which has risen to 93.3% and the rise in college attendance for the 2016 graduates.

MSSP Annual Report




Mr. Reggie Miller, Program Director of the Male Student Support Program (MSSP) gave an Annual Report presentation to the Board. He recapped the goals and objectives of the mentoring organization, also known as the "brotherhood," the various program and community service activities for the past year and the impact on the young men, including 57 students from Orange Preparatory Academy and 15 students from the Career and Innovation Academy of Orange. The overall objective of the MSSP is to reach and positively impact the lives of adolescence males within the Orange community.

Some of the desired outcomes highlighted were:

- Enhanced academic performance
- Increased parent involvement
- Enhanced awareness of preventive health behavior
- Decreased "at risk" behavior
- Developed self-worth and responsibility
- A fostered sense of commitment to the community (Orange Pride)

The MSSP program is provided through the Rutgers - New Jersey Medical School, Division of Adolescent and Young Adult Medicine (DAYAM), in concert with the Orange Board of Education.



Ms. Shelly Harper, Director of Special Services presented the district's *Schools Self Assessment for Determining Grades Under the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act*, for the period, July 1, 2015 - June 30, 2016.

The school self-assessment measures various areas of Harassment, Intimidation and Bullying (HIB) policy, ranging from "HIB Programs, Approaches or Other Initiatives" to "HIB Reporting." Below is a listing of each HIB core element on the grade report presented, as well as

the maximum amount of points possible in that area. The total number of points that can be achieved is 78. The Overall District Total Average Score was 63.45. This information is posted on the district website at http://www.orange.kl2.nj.us.

Public Comments - District Plans Town Hall Meeting

After the presentations, there were inquiries related to the status of Superintendent Lee's contract. It was announced that Superintendent Lee had just received a contract for his review. The letter from Board President Mateo, extending a formal offer to the Superintendent, was read for the record. Additionally, a few parents expressed concerns regarding test scores, the rigor of the district's curriculum and the overall achievement level of all students. Their concerns were addressed and noted for follow-up.

While not a direct response to any expressed concerns, Superintendent Lee announced that the district has planned a Superintendent's Town Hall Meeting, which is scheduled for November 2, 6:00 p.m., at Lincoln Avenue School.

The meeting is an open invitation to the community for a status on the district's Strategic Plan 2014-2017, a 2015-2016 data review, a presentation of 2016-2017 district initiatives, an update on the renovation/construction of Cleveland Street and Orange High Schools and an update on the new STEM School. Superintendent of Schools, Mr. Ronald C. Lee will host the meeting with District Directors giving key presentations. The forum will allow for deeper discussions regarding academic achievement, major district initiatives and facilities plans.
