A Town Hall Meeting, presented by the Superintendent of Schools, Mr. Ronald C. Lee, is scheduled for Wednesday, November 2, 2016, 6:00 p.m., at Lincoln Avenue School. Parents, staff and community stakeholders are invited to attend this special public forum for a status on the district's strategic plan, achievements, challenges and facilities pertinent to the overall mission "to prepare all students with equitable opportunities for college and career readiness, leading to lifelong learning and responsible citizenship in a competitive global community."

Superintendent of Schools, Mr. Ronald C. Lee will lead the meeting, which will include presentations on the status of the district's Strategic Plan 2014 - 2021, a 2015-2016 Data Review, an outline of the 2016-2017 District

Initiative, an update on the renovation and construction of the Cleveland Street and Orange High Schools and an update on the district's planned opening of a STEM high school.

"We want to keep the community informed about the many initiatives and academic achievements in the Orange Public School District," said Superintendent Lee, "It is important that our stakeholders receive information directly from our administrators and it's important for us to hear from the community about their expectations for the district and student achievement." He hopes all those who are invested in the educational system will attend and learn about the district and let their voices be heard.

Orange High School Voter Registration for Week of Respect and Violence Awareness Week

On October 10 - 14, Orange High School collaborated with the National Association of Black Social Workers (NABSW) and the New Jersey Prepared to Vote organization to register eligible high school students to vote.

During this week, students were given information regarding the importance of voting and were encouraged to exercise their civic responsibility. In order to be eligible to vote in the upcoming presidential election, students needed to be age 18 no later than November 8, 2016 and submit their registration on or before October 18, 2016.

By the end of the week, 47 students and staff from Orange High School registered to vote!

The voter registration activity was tied to OHS's celebration of the New Jersey Week of Respect (10/3 – 10/7) and School Violence Awareness Week (10/17 – 10/21). Teachers used the opportunities to discuss respect, as it relates to the tone of the current presidential election and its impact on the community. In addition, the occasions facilitated discussion about the powerful effects of voting on local, state and federal levels. Students were encouraged to think about the laws that affect school and community violence.

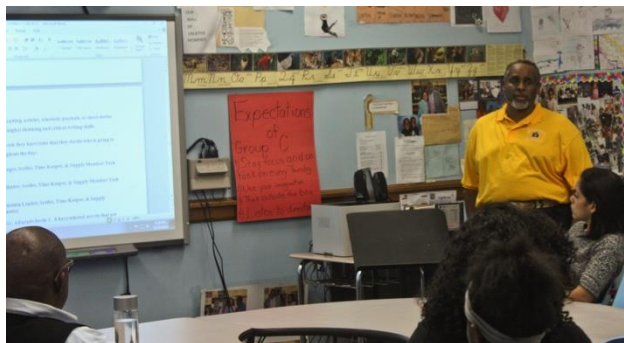

Scholars Academy Back to School Night

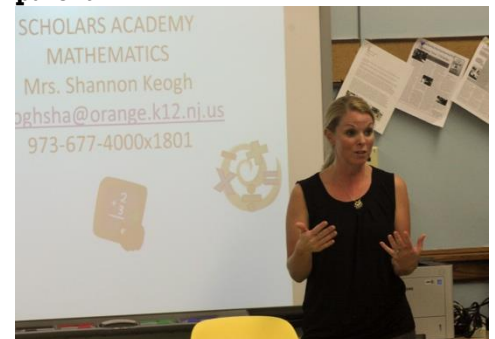

October Activities at Rosa Parks Community School

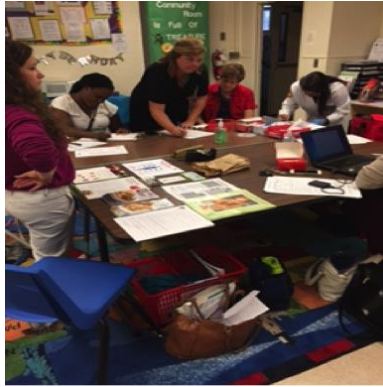
