Saturday Arts Academy Offers 14-Week Program in Music, Dance and Visual

Arts



Through a new partnership with ValleyArts, the Orange Public School District is again offering the Saturday Arts Academy beginning January 25, 2014 and continuing through May 17, 2014. The Academy will provide classes in music, dance and visual arts to students, ages 5 and older, across all grade levels. Classes will be held at the district's Lincoln Avenue School, located at 216 Lincoln Avenue. The sessions will be offered from 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. for 14 Saturdays, as follows:

- January 25
- February 1, 8, 15
- March 1, 8, 15, 22, 29
- April 5, 12
- May 3, 10, 17

Students in the program are also invited to participate in the June 7 Hat City Streets Festival, under the supervision of a parent.

Through ValleyArts, well known arts professionals will take part in the Saturday Arts Academy. The area of music will be led by nationally regarded musician/producer and founder of the South Orange International Blues Festival, Mike Griot, along with music teacher, Peter Abazia. In the area of visual arts, Diedra Harris-Kelly, artist and codirector of the Romare Bearden Foundation in Harlem, along with art instructor, Avril Bogle, will be the artistic leader. The dance section of the Saturday Arts Academy will be led by choreographer and dancer Tiffany Taylor, working in consultation with Deborah Rembert, district dance educator and director of the Orange Dance Conservatory.

The cost of the 14-week program is \$45 per student and \$25 for each additional child from the same household. The fee includes classes in all three subjects. This fun-filled program will give participants more depth and breadth in dance, music, and the visual arts. Private 30 minute music lessons are also available for \$290 for 14 weeks and an adult Zumba Exercise Group will be available from 9:15 – 10:15 a.m., for a fee of \$5 payable at each class session.

Interested parents and students should register now, as class sizes are limited. In person registration will take place on the first day of classes, from 8:30 – 9:00 a.m. Parents must be present to complete additional forms and to make payment in cash or via money orders, payable to ValleyArts.

"He Said, She Said" Public Speaking Competition

On January 27, Orange Public Schools hosted "He Said, She Said", an Annual Speaking Competition which meets Common Core State Standards for English Language Arts, fostering required skills in speaking and listening. In the second year for this event, held at Lincoln Avenue School, there was a notable increase in student participation and preparation.

The "He Said, She Said" competition challenged students in grades 3 - 7 through 7 to sharpen their speaking and presentation skills and to engage in research and writing processes.

There were three categories in the competition. The first category was Prepared Speech. Students selected:

- Macbeth or Hamlet Soliloquy by William Shakespeare
- Strength and Decency by Theodore Roosevelt

The winner of this category was third grader Tamyra Rumble from Park Avenue School. Dressed in a vest with spectacles dangling from the lapel for a bit of authenticity, she delivered Roosevelt's "Strength and Decency" speech. She was expressive in her presentation and had stiff competition from future Shakespearian thespians and orators.

The second category, Extemporaneous Speech, included topics on Mandatory Health Insurance/Obamacare, Social Media, Online Student Assessment and Media Piracy.

Kashema Smith, Lincoln Avenue fourth grader, won with her speech about the efficacy of online testing, sparked with a bit of humor. She removed herself from the podium and was aware of the audience, as were her very challenging and opinionated competitors delivering discourse on the need for healthcare, the ethical dilemma of media piracy and pitfalls and benefits of social media.

The final category called for a duo to deliver a Tech-Assisted Presentations on the following topics:

- Bring Your Own Device To School: Will students power up or will teachers be powerless?
- Music Downloads: Sharing or Stealing?
- Cyber bullying: Is out of sight, out of mind?
- Recycling: Paper, Plastic, Purpose?
- Mandatory Health Insurance: Does it violate a person's right to choose?

The winning duo was from Park Avenue School. Sixth graders Ibrahima Sacko and Jonathan Dulce presented a well organized and supported PowerPoint presentation on recycling. They competed against strong content driven presentations with shared narration.

Along with individual winners, team winners were selected based on individual points totaled by school.

With a total score of 748, Lincoln Avenue School was the first place team. Coming in second, with a combined score of 718 was Park Avenue School and Forest Street coming in third with 577 points.

The district appreciated the efforts and commitment of the students, staff, and families who supported this event. In particular, event host, Dr. Paula Howard, Deputy Superintendent, judges, Superintendent Ronald C. Lee, Orange High School history teacher Jean Jackson and Director of Curriculum and Testing, Dr. Terri Russo along with student assistant, Danella Welcome, winner of the Local Talk Public Speaking Competition. Event organizer, Ms. Erica Stewart, Administrator for Special Projects, expressed gratitude to the teachers who coached and prepared the students from each of the participating schools.
